Church members, please consider volunteering for a three-year term on the 12-member Parish Council. Through monthly meetings you can help lead The Tunbridge Church and guide its service to the church and wider communities

Parish Council members try to represent the congregation's thoughts and ideas. A lot of things happen at this church because of the strong volunteer commitment of church members and friends and the council's oversight.

Church by-laws set the Council's duties. These include preparing the annual budget, maintaining buildings and grounds, serving on specific committees, overseeing personnel, accepting new church members, keeping church records, and managing the accounting of weekly offerings, pledges, gifts and investments.

Accomplishments in recent years include repairs and restoration at the Parish House and the South Tunbridge Community House and grounds, expanded community outreach, improved Food Shelf facilities, fundraising events, more youth activities and occasional scripture and arts programs.

The Parish Council also accepted ministerial candidate Hannah Rogers and sponsorship of DivorceCare, which member Robert Brinkley initiated. The church has a website, thanks to Geoff Hansen, and more frequent newsletters, a logo and color informational brochure. A minister's discretionary account

with separate funding and checkbook was recently established.

Opportunities to serve the church include the Outreach Committee, which arranges welcome bags for Tunbridge newcomers and new church babies, Thanksgiving goodie baskets, Christmas poinsettias and Christmas caroling for older residents and refreshments after funerals.

Children are served through the Christian Education Committee, which holds Sunday School classes. Older kids meet for monthly youth group events and service programs. All ages are invited to summer outdoor family programs.

This year's fundraising events included the successful 5K Walk-Run, to be held annually, which supported Food Shelf renovations; the July yard sale, which Nancy Howe managed and proposes to make an annual event; and the annual canvass letter and special offerings during the year. In the previous three years Holiday in the Hills raised Parish House restoration funds

The church sponsors and provides space for the Food Shelf. A separate committee handles its operation and funds. Churchsponsored community social events include the popular Sugar on Snow, Easter Breakfast and Ice Cream Social

Parish Council members and others take part in and help with important jobs such as scheduling guest ministers and greeters, singing in the adult choir, preparing for Communion Services, putting on two potlucks and a picnic after services, monthly fellowship, decorating the crèche and church for Christmas and much more.

The Tunbridge Church is important to the community and you are important to the church. There are many ways in which you can be involved. We welcome your energy and ideas.
