DivorceCare

You do not need to go through the memories and pain of separation or divorce alone. There is help, hope and healing at DivorceCare. Fall DivorceCare begins September 10, 2013 through December 3, 2013 in the Parish House Living Room. The thirteen weekly sessions run from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. with a one-time \$15 workbook fee covering all the sessions. Scholarships are available. You can enter the seminar at any of the sessions; no need to wait until the next seminar begins. It is best to commit to three or more sessions.

Each week the group discusses the "On My Own" section of the participant workbook and views and discusses a new 40-minute video topic. Experts on divorce and recovery topics on the videos can help guide your recovery from the memories and hurt of separation or divorce.
