April also brought in-person worship services which, at this writing, we have held for eight weeks. They began on Easter Sunday, April 4, when Elaine Howe led the sunrise service on Orchard Road and Pastor Jenny led the

Recent Deaths

Edward Rogers Howe

Ed Howe died unexpectedly at home on April 2 at age 71. He was a native of Tunbridge and a U.S. Army veteran, serving from 1967-1970. For almost 40 years he was an auto mechanic at Herb Crawford's Autoland in South Royalton.

His local pre- and post-retirement activities and positions included being Road Commissioner, Green-Up Coordinator, Fence Viewer, Friends of Tunbridge World's Fair volunteer and tractor shuttle driver at the fair.

He volunteered with Neighbors Helping Neighbors and the Tunbridge Food Shelf, mowed The Tunbridge Church, Parish House and South Tunbridge Methodist Church lawns and made doughnuts and baked for friends and neighbors.

Ed is survived by his wife Nancy, brothers Randall Howe and Arnold Howe and sisters Elaine Howe and Janette Ducey. His cousin and best friend, Bob Rogers, his cohort in many adventures, including a stop at the A&W when they were in Middlebury, died three weeks after Ed.

Robert Brian Rogers

Bob died at home on April 21 at age 71. He grew up in Tunbridge then, after marrying Margaret Sherlock of Tunbridge in 1972, lived in Sharon for 40 years before they returned to Tunbridge.

He retired after 30 years of service as a master electrician with Cold Regions Research and Engineering Laboratory (CRREL) in Hanover. During this time he did work in Alaska, Louisiana and Maine. Bob was a volunteer with the Sharon Fire Department from 1973 -2013. He was a Tunbridge Fair Floral Hall judge and volunteer and a member of the Lions and Hartford Elks.

Bob was a lifelong American Red Cross blood and platelet donor. He helped deliver food to residents during the pandemic. In recent years he, often with brother-in-law Jim Sherlock, could be seen walking along Spring Road.

Survivors include Margaret, his mother Anita, sons Brian (Essie) Rogers and Patrick Rogers and grandsons Devyn and Owyn Rogers. Acts of community service and generosity were suggested in lieu of flowers or a memorial donation to the family kitchen at the Jack Byrne Center for Palliative and Hospice Care.

Susan Cilley Barnaby

Sue, a lifelong church member and longtime church officer and volunteer, director of the Tunbridge Community Food Shelf, former Tunbridge Public Library trustee, and much more, died April 26 at age 63.

She began her career as a teacher and then operated a daycare in her home. At the time of her death Sue was an early childhood interventionist with the Orange-Windsor Supervisory Union, better known as the "Story Lady" and "Math Buddy."

Sue's community activities included her role in the annual Tunbridge Civic Club Show and serving as superintendent of Floral Hall for more than 20 World's Fairs. She and her husband Gordon owned Corner Rail Fence Co. They were the parents of Luke and Erin.

Survivors include brother Dennis (Lisa) Cilley; sisters Patricia (Wayne) Ladd and Brenda Cilley (boyfriend Mike McArdle); and aunt, Joanne (Darrell) Chapman.
